At-Home/Online Learning Model

Please find below important information regarding the selection of the At-Home/Online Learning Platforms for the remaining quarters at O'Leary. This plan may evolve over the duration of the quarters, due to new opportunities or solutions developing.

Class schedules are available on PowerSchool for the 2020/2021 school year.

Remote learning from November 30 to December 18 and January 4 to 8 will be synchronous for all students. For learners who are remote outside of these dates, learning will be delivered through one or more of the three different platforms indicated below, depending upon the course:

- Synchronous Learning
 - Students will access live audio instruction through Microsoft Teams and see the material from the classroom Smartboard on their computer screen at home.
 - Students are expected to complete this course during the regular school day and must be online at the same time as the regular in-school class. Attendance will be taken.
 - Assessments will be completed online unless it is a Diploma course and then the Diploma Exam may then need to be completed in-school or at an Alberta Education approved writing centre.
 - Students would have Teams or email access to their regular classroom teacher during regular school hours, on a 24-hour turnaround time.

- Google Classroom Learning
 - Students would access their regular teacher and the current class resources, assignments and other material through the Google Classroom. Resources and Assignments will be posted following that day's in-class schedule.
 - Assessments will be completed online unless it is a Diploma course and then the Diploma Exam may then need to be completed in-school or at an Alberta Education approved writing centre.
 - Students would have Teams or email access to their classroom teacher during regular school hours, on a 24-hour turnaround time.

- Revelation Online Learning (Instruction provided by Revelations Online teaching staff, in Alternative Education)
 - Revelation online is an independent, self-paced method of course delivery.
 - Some of our options and core courses will be delivered through this learning platform.
 - Assessments will be completed online unless it is a Diploma course and then the Diploma Exam may then need to be completed in-school or at an Alberta Education approved writing centre.
 - Students would have email access to their teacher on a 24-hour turnaround time.

The following regular courses will not be available through a Synchronous Learning, Google Classroom Learning model, or Revelation Online due to course logistics. Students must choose an alternative course through Revelation Online: Plumbing 15/25, Mechanics, Construction, Cosmetology 30, Esthetics 30, Fashion 10/20/30, Drama 10/20/30, Foods 20/30, Financial Management 10/20/30, Legal Studies 20, Ceramics 15/25/35, Design (Architectural Design) , Physical Education 20/30, Architectural Design, Communication Technology (Digital Media Design), Photography 20, Computer Networks, Production Performance Academy, Sports Medicine 20/30, Aboriginal Studies 10/20/30, Advanced Placement (AP) Capstone, Dance 15/25/35, Forensic Studies 25/35.

If a student is scheduled to complete one or more of the above listed courses, they now need to select a new course from Revelation Online (see Alternative Education list for the replacement courses available, at the end of this document). Please see protocol below for course change requests. This only applies to students that selected 'At-Home/Online' learning in the October 5 to 15 survey.

There is an additional learning opportunity that is available for all students who are at-home/online or in-school:

- PASS (Part-Time Alternative Self-Paced School)
 - Self-paced module courses that can be used to accommodate the student's academic needs within a self-paced and individualized learning environment.
 - This takes place during the evening on Monday and Wednesday from 4:00 to 7:00 pm.
 - Students would pick-up and drop-off modules at O'Leary and have an opportunity to work with teachers in the Success Centre on those evenings.
 - There is an additional cost associated with this method through Alternative Education. Please check their website.

If you have chosen the at-home/online option for your child, you will still be connected to Archbishop O'Leary and all school correspondence will still be received and your child is still a student at O'Leary.

As we move into future quarters of this school year, the method of at-home/online delivery may look different as we continually work to better connect with different opportunities for our students.

Course Change Requests

A great deal of time and effort is required of school staff to ensure each and every O'Leary student timetable aligns with the courses requested in the Spring of 2020. However, depending on your core course and option choices this is not always possible.

Course changes will only be made for the following reasons:

- Incomplete schedule - missing required courses for high school completion and/or post-secondary registration.
- Course conflict.
- Change in course mark necessitates a change in course stream (i.e. 30-1 to 30-2).
- Course(s) completed during summer school.
- If a course for an at-home/online student is unavailable due to the delivery model choice.

At-Home/Online Student Textbook Pick-Up

At-home/online students will have a set day and time to come to the school to pick-up their textbooks from the Business Office. This information will be emailed out to all families.

How do I know if my course is Synchronous Learning or through Google Classroom Learning?

At-home/online students will be emailed by their regular classroom teacher to identify which of the two models will be available in their classroom.

What happens if my regular course is not available and I need to take one through Revelation Online?

You would then email your Grade Coordinator to choose a course to replace the credits from the original course. The possible courses available through Revelation Online for you to choose from are listed on the course chart found on the next page of this document.

What day do I start my at-home/online learning?

Your start date is the same as in-class students on Tuesday, November 10.

What happens if I switch from in-school to at-home during the quarter?

If you are in any of the unavailable courses, we will not be able to provide an alternative course for those selections. **If you switch from in-school to at-home, you will remain in that model for**

the rest of the school year, since this decision impacts staffing assignments within the school for in-person courses.

What if I do not make contact with my teacher each day during class?

Course teachers will take attendance each class and enter that into PowerSchool and if a student is marked Absent, then an automated call goes home at the end of the day. If a student is marked Absent for 3 days, then the teacher will contact parents. Absences beyond that will be taken to the Grade Coordinator.

Student engagement in online courses is critical and impacts overall student success.

How will I be assessed if I am at-home/online?

All assessments will be completed using an online format.

Students writing Diploma Exams must complete these in-school or at an authorized writing centre on specific dates and times, as mandated by Alberta Education.
