1 Credit Course

Course Overview	CTR 2310 and CTR3310 are one credit CTS modules where students develop career portfolios - an organized collection of evidence showing accomplishments both in and out of school, as well as a transition plan that focuses beyond Grade 12. A career portfolio contains samples of work that exhibit and reveal the quality and variety of learning, accomplishments, skills and experiences. CTR 2310 begins the process of developing a career portfolio and CTR 3310 bolsters the work done in CTR 2310, giving students an up-to-date tool for self-promotion for employment purposes or educational endeavours such as scholarship applications. CTR 2310 and 3310 require significant work to be completed in myBlueprint, including the digital portfolio feature.
