<p>Course Overview</p>	<p>In Religious Education 25-Jesus Christ: God’s Gift of Salvation, students will closely examine the life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ. They will deepen their understanding of the joy and sacrifice of discipleship by considering the invitation to seek the Truth in all things, and make decisions based on love of God, self and neighbor. In this course, students will have an opportunity to demonstrate their learning through a variety of print, visual and oral media, and deepen their understanding of the Old Testament, each of the four Gospels as four distinct accounts of the message of Jesus; and the early years of Church development and history.</p>
