**Course Overview**

Students will explore historical aspects of globalization as well as the effects of globalization on lands, cultures, human rights and quality of life. Students will explore the relationships among globalization, citizenship and identity. The infusion of multiple perspectives will allow students to examine the effects of globalization on peoples in Canada and other locations, including the impact on Aboriginal and Francophone communities. Students will develop skills to respond to issues emerging in an increasingly globalized world.

To what extent should we embrace globalization?	Students will understand, assess and respond to the complexities of globalization.
<b>Related Issues</b>	<b>General Outcomes</b>
1. Should globalization shape identity?	Students will explore the impacts of globalization on their lives.
2. Should people in Canada respond to the legacies of historical globalization?	Students will understand the effects of historical globalization on Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples.
3. Does globalization contribute to sustainable prosperity for all people?	Students will understand economic, environmental and other impacts of globalization.
4. Should I, as a citizen, respond to globalization	Students will examine their roles and responsibilities in a globalizing world.
