REVISED Designated Entrance and Exit Maps

• With the survey data continually changing, we are no longer having one class of remote synchronous learners. Remote synchronous learners will be part of each class. Therefore, this added three additional physical homeroom classes.

Important School Arrival Details:

- Student arrival time at school should be any time <u>after</u> 8:05 AM. All entrance doors will be open at this time with a supervisor who will:
 - Check that all students are wearing a mask
 - o Provide hand sanitizer at the entrance for all students entering.
 - o Direct students to go DIRECTLY to their homeroom class.
- If students arrive <u>before</u> 8:05 AM, the <u>ONLY</u> entrance open is the **SOUTH MAIN Louis Entrance**. Same procedures as above except the students will proceed DIRECTLY to the supervised Cartier Gym and physically distance until the 8:05 AM bell when they will then go DIRECTLY to their homeroom class.

Important Lunch Hour Details:

- Students must bring healthy lunches to school every day. There is no microwave use and no cafeteria services.
- Handwashing and disinfecting are all part of lunch routines
- Lunch will be staggered and equally distributed through all junior high grades, and this is what it looks like for grade 9:
 - o LUNCH means they are eating in their supervised homeroom classes.
 - RECESS means that they are going with their homeroom teacher for recess that will include a designated place with rotating scheduled activities each day.

After School Details:

- Every block 6 teacher will organize their students at the end of the day for departure.
- Every block 6 teacher will escort safely their class to the designated exit doors where students MUST <u>leave the building</u> at 3 PM.

Grade 9 Orientation Day:

- Wednesday, September 2nd from 12 PM 3 PM
- Arrival at school by 8:30 AM and enter by their designated entrance according to their homeroom class.
- Students must be wearing a mask and use hand sanitizer upon entering.
- Staff will be helping students to find their homeroom class.
- Homeroom teachers will be welcoming students and they will follow the orientation day schedule
- Students should have their own pen for this day.
- Students should <u>not</u> be bringing their school supplies on this day. Students do not have lockers and should only be bringing to school what they need on regular days. Parents your help here is much appreciated.

- Textbooks will be labeled with student names on the book spine and they can be kept in the classroom.
 During regular school days, students can bring their textbooks home if they need them to complete homework or study and returning them to school the next day.
- Each homeroom has a schedule to follow for this day and we look forward to meeting all our grade 9 students!
